- ii. Until further notice, the Court shall conduct two FDC hearings each Friday, to wit: at 10:00 o'clock a.m. and 11:00 o'clock a.m. The FDC Coordinator, or Court Administrator, shall be responsible to assign each FDC participant a hearing time.
- iii. All other requirements of the FDC program shall remain unaffected at this time; however, the FDC Coordinator shall notify each participant of any further changes as soon as is practicable.
